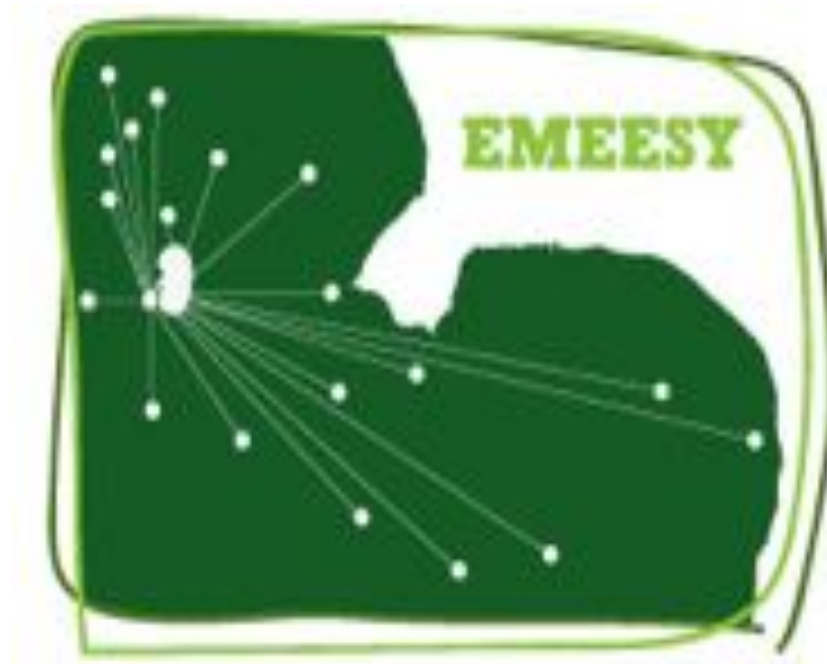
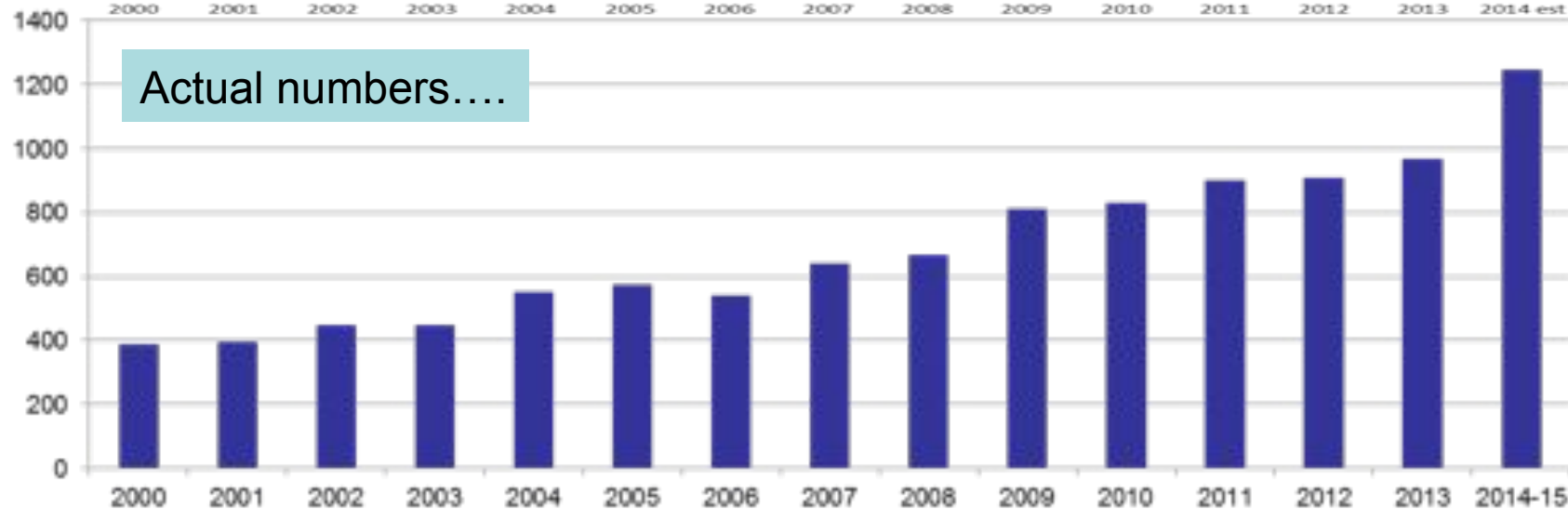
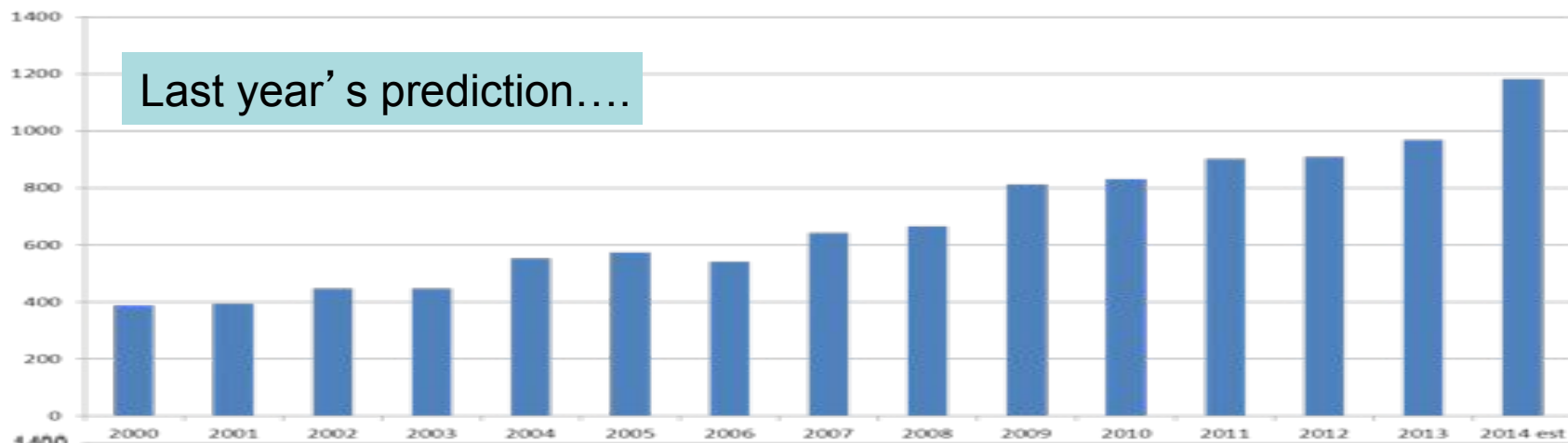

Shared-care clinics



Shared-care clinic dashboard

1. Local link paediatrician available in clinic
2. Link nurse identified
3. Link dietitian identified and available during SCC
4. Same-day phlebotomy service available (or bloods done before clinic)
5. Mechanism in place for specialist blood tests (e.g. white cell cystine, tacrolimus level, rituximab profile)
6. Letters to be typed within 1 week of clinic
7. Results to be viewed next day by link paediatrician
8. Clinic list preview discussion 1 week before clinic
9. Discussion about investigation results within 1 week
10. Corrected letters available to send out within 2 weeks

IT support

- The gold standard option:
 - Able to access all Nottingham information at shared-care clinics, including:
 - Patient letters
 - NotIS (for investigation results)
 - Radiology imaging
 - EMED – to be able to input
 - Able to access wifi for Nottingham emails
 - Able to access local hospital information from Nottingham, for:
 - Interim blood results mainly
 - Patient letters
 - Radiology imaging
 - More comprehensive access to Nottingham information from Leicester and Sheffield

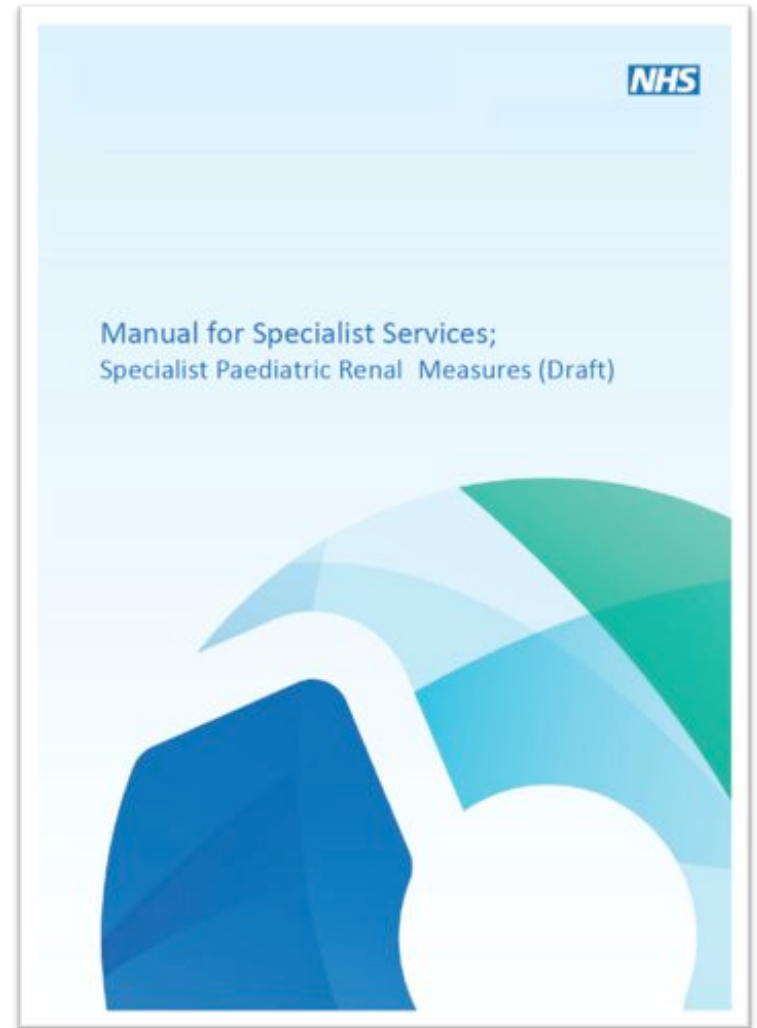

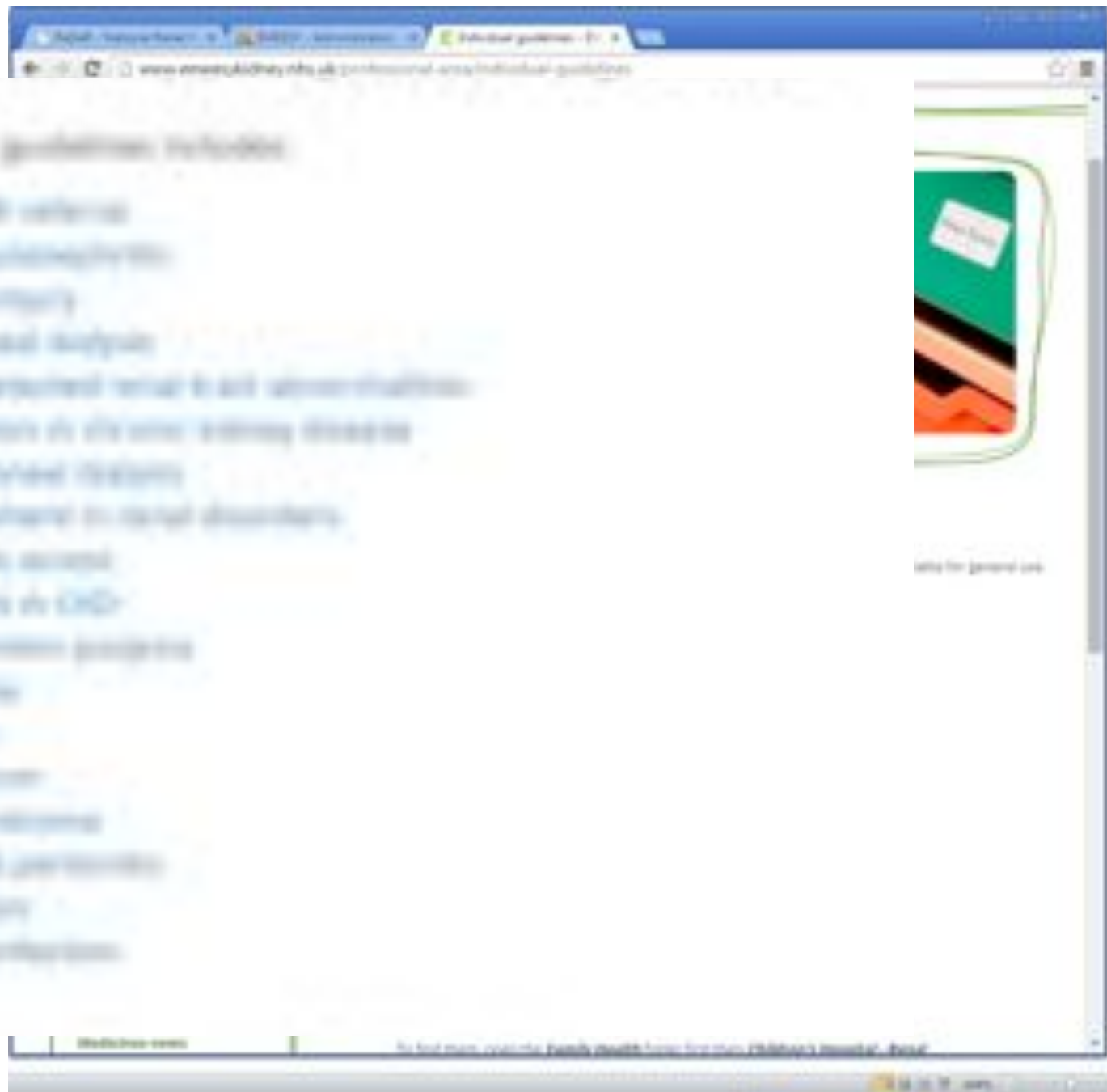
